<p>Create the story of Roman London</p> <p>Create a character from Roman London</p>		<p><i>The Pyrrhic dance</i>, 1869, Sir Lawrence Alma-Tadema</p> <p>Dorian warriors performing the dance before an audience. Though these performers are ancient Greeks the dance was performed by the Romans, and costumes and architecture were similar. At times the Pyrrhic dance was performed in amphitheatres by criminals especially trained for this purpose. 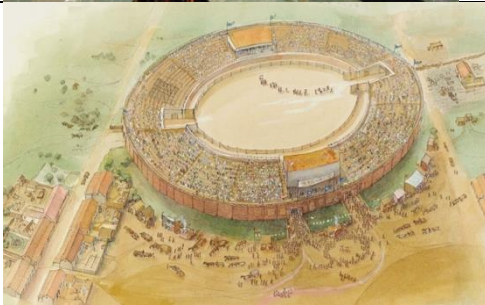


Reconstruction model of the port of Roman London c. AD100 on display in the Museum of London, depicting the first bridge over the Thames.
