ESU PERFORMING SHAKESPEARE (Years 7-9)

- ✓ £45 is the main entry cost
- ✓ £25 for schools with higher than either 20% FSM or 20% EAL
- ✓ Fee waivers can be considered in cases of real need

The fee is for whole school entry (some schools have all of Years 7-9 involved for that one entry fee).

- You have an internal school round
- Regional Final normally 3 performances per school (so 3-6 students depending on combination of duologues or monologues) and this includes an hour's workshop.
- Grand Final normally 2 qualify from each regional final.

ESU-CHURCHILL PUBLIC SPEAKING COMPETITION (Years 9-11)

- ✓ £45 is the main entry cost
- ✓ £25 for schools with higher than either 20% FSM or 20% EAL
- ✓ Fee waivers can be considered in cases of real need

The fee is per team (3 from a squad of 5 that can be rotated between rounds). A school can enter up to two teams.

Four rounds; first on Zoom and the other three in person.

ESU SCHOOL'S MACE DEBATING COMPETITION (Years 7-13)

- ✓ £45 is the main entry cost
- ✓ £25 for schools with higher than either 20% FSM or 20% EAL
- ✓ Fee waivers can be considered in cases of real need

The fee is per team (3 from a squad of 5 that can be rotated between rounds). A school can enter one team.

Four rounds; first on Zoom and the other three in person.

COMPETITION STRUCTURE

Schools have until 01 October to register for the competitions. This is a hard deadline as the Zoom rounds for Mace Debating (round 1) and Churchill Public Speaking (round 1) will take place before Christmas. In the new year, we move to face-to-face once more for the subsequent rounds which will be wonderful.
